
### MESSAGE FROM THE SKIPPER... Jack Hoover, M. D.

It is with great excitement and thanksgiving that I write a few words about the progress and momentum the Mississippi Maritime Museum is making. This year we have made great progress on many fronts, and we have only to thank our Board of Directors, strong committees, our membership, as well as community leaders and coastal legislators. Our rapid progress is only because of an inordinate amount of time many individuals have been spending in their respective areas, and, to them, I say congratulations and thank you. We are well on our way to making this a WORLD CLASS MUSEUM.

Our funding from the State of Mississippi Bond of \$250,000 has been received, and \$250,000 in bond financing will be coming in Dec. 2015. The initial \$100,000 of the 5 year \$250,000 grant has received from Herrin-Chandler Foundation while additional grant applications are being made. The Capital Campaign is scheduled to launch in 2016 with the hiring of a professional director. As we search for this outstanding fund-raiser, your recommendations will be appreciated.

We are working with the City of Pascagoula and the Audubon Society to conserve the bayou and marsh adjacent to the museum. Dr. Mark LaSalle, director of the Audubon Society, is advising our efforts to improve this natural element of the museum's property at the old Pascagoula High School location on Dupont Street, with grant funds.

We helped to welcome Jimmy Buffett, a native son for the dedication of the bridge over Bayou Baptiste in his name. Thanks to Cynthia Garlich for displaying our specially printed WELCOME JIMMY BUFFETT FROM THE MISSISSIPPI MARITIME MUSEUM at strategically located street corners for him to read. He held his head out of the window and waved in greeting to our happy signs.



**We have a Facebook page** which is getting thousands of hits, thanks to the media committee. Thanks, Dr. Doug Belk, Anne Pitre, and Else Martin.

**Exhibits and Display Committee has created 2 displays** with more to come. Suggestions for display locations will spread the educational aspects of maritime history.



## MISSISSIPPI MARITIME MUSEUM REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

### November 2015

The Museum is proud to announce the publication of the Request for Proposal, (RFP), for the Phase One Project construction of the "Maritime Activity Center", (MAC), on DuPont Street, originally the band hall of the old Pascagoula high school. For those members interested in the specific details of the RFP, the RFP is available on the Museum web site, www.msmaritimemuseum.org, and on the MMM Facebook page.

The new MAC will be provided to the community for services, education, and information available in the Mississippi maritime environment. The MAC will contain a 1000 square foot conference room or assembly area, 2000 square foot area for artifact repair, storage and assembly, a small kitchen area, rest rooms and storage, all under roof and air conditioned for comfort. In addition, an area in excess of 3000 square foot under roof for workshops and construction projects for the students and community use. The Museum anticipates other community activities such as the LPK and Jackson County Historical Societies to be involved in events in the MAC, and all local school needs will be invited.



The Exhibits and Displays Committee has, to date, created two displays to promote the Mississippi Maritime Museum. These feature Plexiglas panels with images, text, and brochure holders. They are mobile. The plan is that they will be placed at strategic locations such as the library, lobbies of major buildings, and perhaps the Mississippi Welcome Center. The sites will periodically change.


The displays can be easily altered by printing and inserting new images into the frame. Later, two more displays will be developed, as well as a monitor that will play a closed-loop video of a subject appropriate to the museum. Ultimately, some of these units can be incorporated into the museum building when it opens.

The currently featured subjects are Mississippi-named ships —USS Pascagoula, USS Mississippi and famous Jackson County-related naval officers—Farragut father and son, along with their accomplishments. Suggestions for subjects or other display-related ideas are welcome. Also it would be helpful if any MMM members have contacts who would allow us to place these in the lobbies of a well-visited building (perhaps a bank, public business or local government building).

## 300 years ago.... November 12, 1715



### LAND GRANTED TO JOSEPH SIMON DE LA POINTE

With power and authority for repairing and building ships...

Antoine de la Mothe Cadillac, Governor of the Province of Louisiana and Jean Baptiste Duclas E. Demontigny Esq., kings Councellor and Commissary of Marine commanding the Province aforesaid.

Whereas by a representation to us made by **Joseph Simon de la Pointe**, an inhabitant residing at Dauphine Island, he prays a grant to a certain tract of land which fronts on the Sea Shore, containing one league in width, be it more or less, by one league in depth, running its course due North, bounded on the South by the Fish River, on the West by the Sea shore fronting the Grand Bay and on the East by its depth, for the purpose of placing a stock of cattle and to establish a plantation thereon.

We moreover reserve for the use of his Majesty our Lord and in his behalf, the power and authority to take on the said land all and every kind and description of Timber which may be required for the construction of Forts, Magazines, and other publick works which his Majesty now has or hereafter may order to erect; also such timber and other conveniences as may be necessary in REPAIRING and BUILDING SHIPS, as well as such part of the said land as if may become necessary to erect Fortifications; on condition that Cedar Place which is said to be near Fish River, shall not be included in the tract of land above granted, in all or any part thereof, in faith whereof we have signed these presents and ordered to be registered in the office of the Supreme Council of the Province aforesaid; within two months from this date.


