Lifetime memberships are in! Seven have been accepted since our original announcement... Renewal season is in full swing, and MMM 2017 membership currently stands at 49. Local Ship in the News!

Usually when a Jackson County built Navy ship is in the news, it's a destroyer or cruiser built at Ingalls, but recently another locally produced ship was the center of attention.

The USNS *Bowditch* was conducting research off the Philippine coast when a submersible drone it was controlling was captured by the Chinese Navy. Thankfully, the situation will be peacefully resolved, but it brings to light a very interesting category of U.S. Navy ships.

USNS designates United States Naval Ships, which are owned by the U.S. Navy and operated by Military Sealift Command for the Naval Oceanographic Office (NAVOCEANO). They have civilian crews and conduct oceanography research including marine acoustics, marine geology geophysics, and gravimetric and magnetic surveying.

VT Halter has produced several entire classes of research ships for the U.S. Navy with names associated

with maritime explorers and scientists. USNS *Bowditch* was built by VT Halter in 1994 as one of seven *Pathfinder*-class survey ships. USNS *Bowditch* is the fourth Navy ship to bear the name honoring Nathaniel Bowditch who was born in Salem, Mass.,

March 26, 1773. An astronomer and navigator, he published the first edition of *The New American Practical Navigator* in 1802 and authored numerous other scientific works.

You can distinguish these ships from commissioned Navy ships (USS) by their paint schemes. USNS vessels are often painted a bright white and have distinctive blue and gold stripes on their stacks.
